

## Indwelt with God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost

**Joh 14:15 If ye love me, keep my commandments. 16 And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever; 17 Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. 18 I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you. 19 Yet a little while, and the world seeth me no more; but ye see me: because I live, ye shall live also. 20 At that day ye shall know that I am in my Father, and ye in me, and I in you. 21 He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him. 22 Judas saith unto him, not Iscariot, Lord, how is it that thou wilt manifest thyself unto us, and not unto the world? 23 Jesus answered and said unto him, If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him.**

I had never noticed, until this morning, that the born again sinner has the indwelling of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. I somehow never put together; when you are born again and indwelt with the Holy Spirit; you are also indwelt with God the Son and God the Father. This makes perfect (complete) sense; as we believe that these three are the Godhead.

**"18 I will not leave you comfortless:"** Comfortless means: *bereaved, orphan, parentless, fatherless.* Herein lies a great mystery. Christ is telling his disciples, I am going away bodily, but you will not be left alone as orphans. At my bodily departure from earth, I will send you the Holy Spirit, and you will have me with you again, just not in bodily presence.

Christ established the church while he was here, and left it here when he ascended back into the heaven from whence he came. Therefore, we have a mother here in the world if we are born again. Since, in the process of being born again we are indwelt with the godhead, we are not fatherless, either. After all, Christ taught to pray: ***Lu 11:2 And he said unto them, When ye pray, say, Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, as in heaven, so in earth.*** So we have God the Father, as seen already indwelling us, and we have the church in which we dwell here in time. We are not orphans, since we have both parent figures present with us.

**"Joh 14:1 Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me."** And **"Isa 40:1 Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God."** If you are a born again child of God; you should not be troubled, and you should have comfort, knowing that the time is coming, when we will be in the eternal presence of the complete Godhead.

This is another reminder, to myself, of how weak and helpless I am. This demonstrates how little I see and understand of scripture. This shows the smallness of my mind. Praise the Lord for the revelations from his word of truth to we poor sinners, saved by his grace.

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
